Enclosed Trailer Rental Prep Checklist:

- 1. E-Track & Tie-Downs
- □ Install E-track on walls and/or floor
- ☐ Use a screw in every hole
- □ Provide O Rings for E-Track
- □ Provide E-Track Accessories
- 2. Interior Setup
- □ Add LED interior lighting
- ☐ Make sure flooring is clean and non-slip
- ☐ Mount spare tire securely
- □ Add hooks or bins for strap storage
- 3. Signage & Labels
- □ Apply vinyl graphics to outside
- □ Add safety reminders inside etc ie: ("Secure Cargo Before Driving")
- □ Label where straps, tools go
- □ Add trailer/unit number front and back
- 4. GPS & Locks
- ☐ Find secure spot for GPS
- □ Add Air-Tag for additional security
- ☐ Matching code locks for doors and hitch
- 5. Produce Marketing Images
- □ Stage/Dress the trailer
- □ Use sun/natural light to advantage
- ☐ Horizontal photos with trailer centered
